  - Membership fees £4800

  - In addition to the £2400 above, a further £3600 was donated in the previous financial year
  - £1500 x 3 planned this financial year
  - Total of £10500 donated to the 3 charities since they were adopted as the club's charities

#### Club Membership:-

 We propose to keep the annual membership fee at £30 given: our income from membership fees exceeds our administration costs; an increase when living costs are high would seem unnecessary; and we think £30 represents excellent value for money.  Question from the floor - Have we considered second claim? Ie half price membership if members are affiliated to another cycling club. - Not currently considered but the committee will review at a later meeting.

### **Election of officers :-**

- Four committee members put themselves forward for re-election. Two
  members stood down from the committee; we received one nomination
  each for the vacant roles of Treasurer and Marketing/Comms Officer Neil
  and George respectively.
- All six positions, therefore, were uncontested negating the need for any
  vote.
- Neil and George, therefore, are formally appointed to the committee for the next year joining Paul McCormick (Chairman), Robert Macmenemey (Deputy Chairman), John Dawson (Secretary) and Sharon Tinnon (Welfare and well being).
